

WALSER VILLAGE WARTH



Warth at the Arlberg - panoramic perch with boundless charm.

Idyllically nestled at 1,500 m above sea level in the midst of an impressive mountain panorama, the village of Warth is where the Walser people chose to settle as early as the 14th century.

As early as 1894, a man from Warth was known for a pioneering performance: Pastor Johann Müller, the first person in this area to travel on skis.

The considerable amount of snow gave the parson the idea of using long wooden slats, which he ordered from Sweden, for his journeys to the neighbouring resort of Lech.

With the construction of the first ski lifts in the mid-1960s and the expansion of federal highways, tourism experienced a steady upswing that continues to this day. Despite strong development of the tourism sector, the charming Walser character of the former mountain farming village has been preserved.

Together with Hochkrumbach, about 170 people live in Warth all year round. Nine existing hotels are mostly family businesses, which are now operated by second and third generations.



WALSER VILLAGE SCHRÖCKEN



Schröcken – extensive hilltop settlement with a magnificent mountain backdrop, settled in the Walser style.

Schröcken is characterised by its extremely varied landscape, retaining the typical character of a Walser village with widely scattered hamlets and individual farms. The name Schröcken (Middle High German

"schrecken" for "to burst", "to split") is associated with the rugged mountain landscape, whereby the former name "Giersboden" – after "Gir" for bird of prey – prevailed until 1640.

The village experienced a pioneering achievement by Alfons Strolz, who had the first tow lift built in 1953. In 1964, he founded the Schröcken ski lifts.

The Hochtannberg road expansion in 1954 was another milestone in tourism development.

Today 210 people live in Schröcken all year round, most of them represented in one of the many associations. The scattered settlement, divided into nine districts in Schröcken, is typical of a Walser village. Located on slopes and plateaus, the community is divided from Unterboden at 1,150 meters up to the natural jewel Körbersee lake at 1,660 meters above sea level.

Accommodations in Schröcken range from cosy, comfortable holiday apartments and B & B arrangements to hotels with half-board and luxury chalets.



SKI HISTORY

Warth-Schröcken's ski history started in the 19th century when pastor Johann Müller was the first to ski the route from Warth to Lech and back in the deeply snow-covered terrain. He is proudly counted among the first ski pioneers on the Arlberg.*

DIFFICULT START.

The Walser people, who populated the Tannberg region (Warth, Schröcken and Lech), had a meagre and hard life as mountain farmers. Until the beginning of the 20th century, they lived exclusively from dairy farming and cattle breeding. Well-developed access roads were out of the question at the time. The villages could only be reached via mule tracks or cart trails. Especially in the rough winters, places were sometimes cut off from each other and the surrounding valleys for weeks.



FIRST BEGINNINGS OF WINTER TOURISM.

It can be said the beginnings of winter tourism were due to the steady increase of guests during summer months.

This made it possible for the "Widderstein" inn in Nesslegg to open at the beginning of 1900 in addition to the already existing "Zum Ochsen" inn (today's "Tannberg" inn in Schröcken).

In Warth, guests found lodging in the parsonage, as well as in the "Tirolerhof" and "Adler" inns. Construction of the "Biberkopf" hotel, which opened in 1928, set new standards, because the installation of central heating meant that winter guests could be comfortably accommodated for the first time.



FOUNDING THE FIRST SKI SCHOOLS & CONSTRUCTING THE FIRST SKI LIFTS.

Another milestone in Warth-Schröcken's tourism development was the establishment of the first ski schools. Warth Ski School was founded by Otto Fritz in 1926 and Schröcken-Körbersee Ski School by Fritz Strolz in 1936. During the Second World War and introduction of the Thousand Mark Ban, tourism in Warth-Schröcken came almost to a complete standstill. Tourism was reawakened and further investments in the infrastructure began years later. It wasn't until 1954 that the first ski lift was built in Warth and other lifts followed. In 1963, the Warth ski lifts and Schröcken ski lift company were founded as construction of the Saloberkopf lifts began.

MILESTONES OF THE SKI REGION DEVELOPMENT.


At the end of the 1970s, the connection from Warth to Schröcken was realised, and the resulting ski area "Warth-Salober" became the third largest ski area in Vorarlberg. In the winter of 2013/14, the most important milestone in Warth-Schröcken's history of sking was achieved: after 41 long years of discussion, the connection was made to the Arlberg by the Auenfeldjet. In the winter of 2016/17, the last gap on the Arlberg was closed with the new Flexenbahn aerial cableway, so ambitious skiers can reach all places on the Arlberg on skis in just one day. In December 2017, the Warth cable car connecting the village centre to the ski area was brought into operation.



WARTH-SCHRÖCKEN TODAY.

The historical and touristic development with all its implemented milestones has paved the way to Warth-Schröcken becoming a modern and sporty ski area today. Now the "Ski Arlberg" ski resort is not only the largest connected ski area in Austria, but also one of the five largest in the world. With more than 300 kilometres of downhill skiing, 200 kilometres of deep snow as well as 87 lifts and cable cars, the ambitious skier has a new dimension of winter sports fun on the Arlberg.

THE SKI LEGENDS OF WARTH

> Wiltrud Drexel, born 1950.

HFR PATH.

This lady is number one in the history of Warth Olympic success.

The ski racer Wiltrud Drexel was Austrian champion four times, won the bronze medal in the Giant Slalom at the Sapporo (Japan) Olympics in 1972 and won the Downhill World Cup in the 1968/69 season.

She also won the Downhill bronze medal at the 1974 World Championships.

And she even had 22 podium appearances and five Downhill victories in the World Cup.

Today she still lives in Warth and runs her own guest house, which proudly displays the Olympic Rings on its facade.





AN OVERVIEW OF THEIR SUCCESSES.

- > Downhill World Cup winner in 1968/69.
- > Bronze medal in the Giant Slalom at the 1972 Winter Olympic Games in Sapporo (Japan).
- Bronze medal in the Downhill at the 1974 World Championships in St. Moritz (Switzerland).

- > Four-time Austrian champion.





> Hubert Strolz, born 1962.

HIS PATH.

Exactly 34 years before his son Johannes Strolz wrote his own success story, Hubert Strolz won the Olympic gold medal in the Combined Slalom in Calgary (Canada) in 1988 – and silver in the Giant Slalom.

Hubert "Hubsi" Strolz can look back on over 30 podium appearances.





Today he lives and works without the cameras on him in the small mountain village of Warth.


Together with his wife Birgit, he lives in Haus Hubertus, where Birgit takes care of the guests and Hubert is a passionate farmer.

He promotes young talents as a ski instructor at local ski school in Warth.



AN OVERVIEW OF HIS SUCCESSES.

- > Europa Cup overall winner in 1981/82.
- > First World Cup podium in 1984 in Adelboden (Switzerland).
- Gold medal in the Combined Slalom and silver in the Giant Slalom at the 1988 Calgary Winter Olympics (Canada).
- > Over 30 podium appearances and one World Cup victory.



> Johannes Strolz, born 1992.

HIS PATH.

After two years in the ski secondary school in Schruns, Johannes made to the Stams ski grammar school.

From there he launched into his first successes, such as winning the bronze medal in the Super-G at the Alpine Junior Championships in 2012.

In the 2017/18 season, Johannes won the overall standings in the Europa Cup

Due to a lack of success in the World Cup, he lost his squad affiliation in the ÖSV in spring 2021. He now has to organise his training himself and even tune his own racing skis.

As a complete surprise, he had his first World Cup victory on January 9, 2022 in Adelboden (Switzerland) with start number 38.

On the 22nd of January 2022, he achieved fifth place in the slalom in Kitzbühel (Tyrol - Austria).



OLYMPIC FAIRYTALE 2022.

It was one of the most emotional moments in the Winter Olympic Games 2022 in Beijing, a moment that excited all of Austria, crossing their fingers for one of their own from Warth.

One who was always a talent in the world of Ski Racing, who strove to be like his father, the Olympic champion Hubert Strolz. At the age of 29, however, hardly anyone believed he could still make a huge breakthrough.

The Olympic Games became his moment, his big show, his personal triumph. The story of an athlete with an honest competitor's heart,


who never gives up, stays modest, always believes in himself, who is passionately supported by his successful father and at the end, was rewarded on the big stage.



- The fifth place in the downhill race on February 10, 2022 was the basis for later winning the gold medal in the Combined event.
- Six days later, the silver medal in the Olympic Slalom followed. Just like his father Hubert, who won Olympic gold in Calgary (in the Combined event) and silver (in the Giant Slalom) 34 years earlier.
- And as the icing on the cake, Johannes won the gold medal in the Team Competition on the last day of the Winter Games on February 20, 2022.
- > **Achiever of the Year:** Selected the Achiever of the Year for 2022.

"THE WHITE RING" SKI CIRCUIT.

A half-day, sporty challenge with 22 kilometres of ski runs and an elevation difference of approximately 5,500 meters in total on easy and medium-difficulty ski runs with viewing platforms.

TIPP: Visit the **Kästle Museum** at the Rüfikopf mountain station.

"RUN OF FAME" SKI CIRCUIT.

Spectacular ski circuit through the Ski Arlberg ski region. The 85-kilometre round trip with 18,000 meters elevation difference leads from the Dorfbahn Warth over the Saloberkopf to Lech Zürs and St. Anton/Rendl. It is dedicated to those ski pioneers and stars from sports and film who once glided down the snow-covered slopes.

TIPP: Hall of Fame - interactive exhibition in the Flexenbahn mountain station about ski stars on the Arlberg.

Warth-Schröcken is part of the Ski Arlberg ski region and, due to its extremely favourable north-west orientation, is one of the regions in Europe with the most natural snow.


