Arrival in the region

The Wilder Kaiser region lies in the Tyrolean lowlands between Kufstein and Kitzbühel in the Sölllandl. The airport cities of Munich (1,5h - 120km), Salzburg (1h - 80km) and Innsbruck (1h - 80km) can be reached easily by car or train.

The nearest train stations are Kufstein, Wörgl, Kitzbühel and St.Johann / Tirol. From there, public buses travel to the

Night skiing

In the evening, Hochsöll – the white arena at the foot of the Hohe Salve mountain – can be seen lit up from afar. From Wed to Sat, 10 km of irresistible, freshly groomed slopes across the largest night skiing area in Tirol invite you to carve turns in the floodlit snow. Don't miss out on enjoying unforgettable hours of skiing and tobogganing until late



Après-ski

When the cable cars stop running, the skiing day is far from over. In the après-ski bars the parties go on long into the night! Especially in March, overnight guests can make the most of spring skiing with free guided ski tours through the SkiWelt Wilder Kaiser-Brixental. The ski guides make their final stop of the day at one of the ski area's "Skihüttengaudi" party huts, where skiers can enjoy live music.



Ski Night and Village Evening

Comprising a ski show, après-ski party and PistenBully snow groomer parade, the Ellmau Ski Night takes place every Monday. Mulled wine and Jagertee are served to keep visitors warm. In Scheffau, locals and guests meet at the music pavilion every Wednesday for the Winter Village Evening with music and farm stalls selling traditional delicacies such as fresh doughnuts.



Ski bus

The free ski bus runs regularly between all the ski bus stops in your holiday resort, making it easy for you to reach the various cable car valley stations and the village centres


without a car.

Childcare

Skiing

The region offers all-day childcare facilities on the mountain and in the valley for the smallest of children, enabling parents to discover the 284 kilometres of slopes offered across the SkiWelt Wilder Kaiser-Brixental all by themselves. At **KiKo Söll**, children can play in and around an old





farmhouse and are looked after by childminders from the Söll-Hochsöll ski school. The KiKo childcare centre is situated immediately next to the Söll valley station and can be booked for toddlers $(1-2\frac{1}{2}$ years) and young children who want to learn to ski (2 ½ – 5 years).

The **Snow Pirates Kids Club** is located right beside the Brandstadl mountain station in Scheffau at the heart of the SkiWelt Wilder Kaiser-Brixental. Parents can embark on a day of carefree skiing, safe in the knowledge that their little ones are being taken care of and are enjoying their own adventures inside or outside at 1,650 metres above sea level.

The Hartkaiserbahn mountain station (1,520 m) in Ellmau provides the region's young visitors (2–5 years) with a very special home for the day. The children are cared for in a safe, secure environment by trained childminders and can look forward to activities and a lot of fun.





Uncover the peaceful side of winter by taking a romantic

trip on a horse-drawn sleigh and discover the villages in the Wilder Kaiser region at a relaxing pace as the coachman tells you stories about the old farmhouses. Breathe in the crisp winter air as dusk falls and see out the day snuggled under the warmth of a fur blanket.

Accommodations

With its natural and well-groomed toboggan runs, the Wilder Kaiser region is already well-known and popular as a "sledging club". A total of more than 12 kilometers, partly snow-capped and spread over four family-friendly toboggan runs, ensure that the runners come fully in motion.
