With countless astonishing nuances, ideal for a weekend getaway as well as for a long holiday, Veneto is a tourism-oriented territory, as its many excellent hotels, holiday farms, bed & breakfasts, apartment hotels, relais, historical villas, luxury campsites, amazing restaurants and classy stores clearly show.

In the Veneto land, you can also enjoy a spa holiday - internationally known and appreciated and boast high-standard equipment - or you can discover our art centres, among the most visited in Italy: magical Venice, Palladian Vicenza, Verona with its Arena and legendary opera season, Padua with Giotto's frescos and the Basilica of Saint Anthony, Treviso with its ancient palaces, its waters, its prestigious exhibits, Belluno with its elegant historical centre and its majestic Duomo, Rovigo with its refined Loggia dei Notari and its rich Art Gallery... Then there are places of international standing, such as the beautiful Asolo, much loved by Eleonora Duse, cities surrounded by finely preserved medieval walls, such as Cittadella and Montagnana, amazing nature reserves to discover by bike or on foot, smaller cities full of precious treasures, the routes of the Great War between the Asiago Plateau and Monte Grappa, Bassano with its Wooden Bridge suspended over the Brenta river and Jacopo da Ponte (known as "Bassano") paintings... Beauty, history, nature, art, flavours, colours and magnificent landscapes everywhere. A journey with countless destinations, one more interesting than the other, each one marvellously unforgettable.



Belluno Dolomites

Just over an hour from Venice, there is a place kissed by beauty, which encapsulates a thousand faces and one soul, a territory that leaves you speechless: the Belluno Dolomites, the Mountains of Venice.

Oh, yes...they are known as the Mountains of Venice because the lagoon is so close to these mountains that on a fine day, looking up from Piazza San Marco towards the horizon, the Belluno Dolomites emerge as the backdrop to an extraordinary visual treat. This phenomenon is a rare atmospheric condition known locally as "stravedamento" (crystal-clear clarity), unique in the world. And, even if only to see up close what appears in the distance from Venice, the trip is worth it because the immense region of the Belluno Dolomites embraces an extraordinary variety of landscapes, identities and places.

HERE ARE 10 REASONS TO VISIT THESE PLACES

THE UNIQUE VIEWS

The Dolomite peaks have been a UNESCO World Heritage Site since 2009 and rank among the most beautiful mountains in the world. They have a variety of shapes, colours and landscapes, characterised by imposing mountains, vertical peaks and deep gorges. The Dolomites were formed around 250 million years ago in tropical marine environments and represent a rare example of sedimentary rocks and orogeny processes. They are therefore a natural laboratory for study of the Earth's history and plate tectonics: they are, in fact, an exceptional testimony to our planet's geological history.

THE ENROSADIRA

A unique natural phenomenon, the 'Dolomite Glow' tints the rocky walls and peaks of the mountains with shades of pink, orange and red during sunrise and sunset, thanks to the particular composition of Dolomite rock. It's a visual event of rare beauty.



THE COLOURS

Each season paints the territory with its unique colours: sparkling snow and ice in winter, blooming flowers in spring, lush green meadows in summer and warm foliage hues in autumn. Every corner tells a story of natural beauty and climatic variety.

A VALUE-LADEN CONTRAST

Down below, the Valbelluna; up above, the Dolomites. This is the territory of Belluno: on one hand, the Valbelluna, an area enclosed between Lake Santa Croce and Lake Corlo, a wide valley with gentle slopes overlooking the Dolomite peaks; on the other hand, the Alpine peaks, which can be reached by 'via ferrata' (assisted mountain trail) or ski lift. Such peaks can also be simply contemplated from afar, enjoyed in their magnificence.

THE TAILORED GREAT OUTDOORS

The Belluno Dolomites are the ideal destination for those who love sports and outdoor activities. There are options for all levels: from beginners to professionals. This



is a place where everyone finds their own perfect solution. In summer, the mountains offer trekking, hiking, Nordic walking, climbing and via ferrata hikes. The crystal-clear waters of lakes, rivers and streams are perfect for river trekking, canyoning, windsurfing, kitesurfing and canoeing, or simply relaxing in the sun. For lovers of cycling, the roads of the Giro d'Italia, the Bike Parks and trails of the Belluno Dolomites offer epic challenges



and exciting views, ideal for road bikes, Gravel or Mountain Bikes. With the arrival of the snow, the valleys turn into a winter paradise. Skiing and snowboarding are possible over 300 km of Dolomiti Superski slopes, but there's also Nordic skiing, snowshoeing, mountaineering, freeriding, snow biking and even snow kitesurfing.

AUTHENTICITY AND TRADITIONS

The calendar here is punctuated by events and traditions that entertain the community and visitors. Traditions are handed down with love, giving visitors an authentic experience. Every moment of the year has its own celebration, its own ritual. It begins with the celebrations for Christmas and Epiphany, then comes Carnival with its masks, different and unique in each valley. Easter brings the Belluno focaccia to dinner tables, while the arrival of spring heralds celebrations welcoming new buds and blossoms. Summer celebrates the sun, the heat and the markets in village streets, and the unique Palio di Feltre (medieval parade and bareback horse race). Autumn is the time for delicious flavours: grapes, pumpkin, honey, cheese, apples, chestnuts and walnuts are honoured as unique gifts. Then, from the mountainside huts, the downstream return of flocks is cause for a party in the villages: Se Desmonteghea! In other words, it's a seasonal return to the valley, with the festival of transhumance.



INTERNATIONAL EVENTS

From sport to culture to entertainment, these mountains host unique events that attract visitors and athletes from all over the world, enhancing the region with top-level competitions, cultural festivals and art exhibitions. Here nature and modernity meet. Each event becomes an opportunity to celebrate the greatness of these

mountains, promoting not only the scenic beauty, but also the organisational ability along with the hospitable and dynamic spirit of the local communities.

BELLUNO DOLOMITES NATIONAL PARK

31,512 hectares of National Park: a treasure trove of biodiversity all year round. With springs, marshes and waterways, the broadleaf and coniferous woodlands alternate with majestic rock faces, offering a rich and varied habitat to explore.



THE CULTURE

With works of art, historic churches, museums, castles and Venetian villas, the past is intertwined with the present, telling stories of a time when this region was a crossroads between Venice and Northern Europe. For centuries, the precious wood of these territories has supported the construction of Venice and the Venetian gondolas,

creating a unique connection between the mountains and the Serenissima. The established cultural and commercial traditions are still visible today and underline a deep historical and cultural bond. Belluno and Feltre, the two main towns in the province, offer charming historic centres, perfect for strolling among cosy cafes, quaint shops, historic buildings and museums.



A FILLIP OF FLAVOUR

A journey to the Belluno Dolomites cannot fail to treat the tastebuds, with a cuisine enhanced by authentic flavours and ancient traditions. In the award-winning restaurants, in the mountain huts and at the local producers, you can taste the local products, washed down with Dolomite beer (made with barley grown in the National Park), or with excellent wines made with a new variety of vines: the resistant PIWI vines of Feltrino and Valbelluna, which guarantee a sustainable and high quality production. Some local products that deserve a special mention include lamb from Alpage, a citadel of Slow Food that guarantees excellent, tasty and tender meat; Valbelluna beans (Gialet bean, Slow Food garrison; the Lamon bean, P.G.I. (Protected Geographical Indication) and the Mame dell'Alpage), the Piave cheese which is the PDO cheese of the Belluno Dolomites, the dairy cheeses and finally the Honey of the Belluno Dolomites PDO. Typical dishes include casunzei (fresh pasta ravioli stuffed with red beetroot, ricotta cheese or potatoes, often served with melted butter and poppy seeds) and pastin (minced pork and beef, spiced and pressed in a patty shape).

IN THE NATURAL PARK OF THE D'AMPEZZO DOLOMITES

At the crack of dawn and as dusk falls, the majestic Tofane, the Averau group, the Croda da Lago, the Cristallo and Sorapis massifs light up in pink, giving life to one of the most extraordinary visual effects in the world. We are in the heart of the Ampezzo Dolomites, whose undisputed gem is Cortina d'Ampezzo, a worldly resort with a picturesque historic centre, luxury hotels and exclusive boutiques. A land full of fabulous legends and ancient folklore. Beautiful in summer for those who love walking, cycling, and climbing; fantastic in the cold season for winter sports enthusiasts, thanks to its three ski resorts with hundreds of kilometres of snow-covered slopes nestled among dream-like mountains.

Cortina

Cortina d'Ampezzo, the "Queen of the Dolomites", is one of the most fascinating and prestigious tourist destinations in the world. Nestled among the majestic Dolomite peaks, it is the ideal place for those looking for nature, sport, culture and refinement. An icon of alpine skiing and home to international competitions, Cortina is preparing to host the 2026 Olympic and Paralympic Winter Games, reconfirming its role as a world leader in sport. In summer, the pathways, the 'via ferrata' routes, bike trails and climbs attract mountain enthusiasts and lovers. But the charm of Cortina reaches beyond nature: in its exclusive centre, with luxury boutiques and gourmet restaurants, you can breathe in a cosmopolitan atmosphere, without losing sight of the important bond with tradition. Ladin culture, still alive, is reflected in the authentic flavours, festivals and craftsmanship, giving visitors a unique and authentic experience where past and present meet.

Verona

Set in a territory rich in historical testimony and beautiful landscapes, Verona is one of the most valuable and well-known cities of art in Italy. Not far from Lake Garda, it welcomes visitors at the foot of green hills bordered to the north by Monte Baldo and the Lessini Mountains. This fantastic scenery is an ideal setting for those who love trekking and hiking in a fairy-tale succession of vineyards, orchards, olive groves, meadows and beech forests. Built in ancient times in a cradle on the banks of the Adige, this beautiful city is known, among other things, for the historic Roman Arena, which in summer hosts great shows, concerts and opera seasons. Juliet's house is another famous destination, with its romantic balcony that features in the most famous love story written by Shakespeare. Verona, a UNESCO site since 2000, offers unforgettable

itineraries spanning different historical periods: Piazza delle Erbe where Roman, medieval and Renaissance architecture blend harmoniously; Piazza dei Signori, an elegant Verona salon; the Castelvecchio Fortress, now a museum; Ponte Pietra; and the Arche Scaligere, superb funerary monuments from the Gothic period dedicated to members of the Della Scala family. Also well worth seeing are the Roman theatre and the Archaeological Museum, the beautiful Giusti Renaissance Garden and, among the religious buildings, the Duomo with its precious frescoes, the church of San Fermo and the Romanesque Basilica of San Zeno Maggiore. A starting point for interesting excursions in one of the most versatile areas of the Venetian province, Verona is just a few kilometres from the lake, the mountains, the hills and the plain.



LAKE GARDA VENETO

The Venetian shore of Lake Garda is a world of many places and emotions, an endless source of surprises among wonderful Mediterranean landscapes softened by a consistently mild climate. Here, excellent local extra virgin olive oils and fine typical wines await you, to be enjoyed within the surroundings of blue waters, green countryside delineated by olive groves and vineyards, high mountains in the background, and enchanting villages. Other attractions abound, with thousands of opportunities for a relaxing wellness holiday in the name of culture, art, fun and good food complete with freshwater fish specialities.

Italy's largest lake is also a paradise for water sports and outdoor activities, where sports and nature lovers can train all year round in this open-air 'gym'. Entering the hinterland, there are glimpses of views stretching to over 2,000 metres on Monte Baldo.



LESSINIA

To the north of the city lies Lessinia, the "mountain of Verona" which, with over 10,000 hectares, has been part of the Lessinia Regional Park since 1990, a vast territory that contains a surprising variety of flora and fauna, as well as naturalistic, historical and archaeological evidence of huge value. The park is frequented by hikers, mountain bikers, horse riding enthusiasts, nature lovers and winter sports devotees, but also by those who simply wish to relax and recharge their batteries while breathing in the clean mountain air.

The Lessinia Park is a gentle plateau that invites you to discover its charm through slow and respectful tourism. Its gentle views, shaped by nature, are intertwined with unexpected glimpses of stone 'contrada' districts, each with a timeless charm. Here, the thriving traditions of the ancient Cimbri tribe are handed down, as well as the unmistakable flavour of local cheeses and the must-try gnocchi di malga, to be enjoyed at high altitude.





THE PLAIN OF THE DOGES

Earth, water, sky. These are the vital elements of a territory in which nature, always an unrivalled mistress, has shaped contours and borders. It is a region with bright autumn colours that are clouded by the enveloping winter mists that give a sense of mystery to the landscape, while in summer it is exciting to see the sun settle over the horizon and then disappear.

It is an area characterised by extensive cultivated spaces, where the highest expression of peasant culture emerges. Here are grown the rice of Isola della Scala, the Veronese radicchio, the potato of Cologna Veneta, the cabbage of Castagnaro and the apple of Zevio. The great expanses of crops are interrupted by the river that dominates and gives life to this countryside: the Adige. In addition to the rural tradition, craftsmanship has also made its way here and the area has become known for its production of furniture.

VALPOLICELLA

The toponym Valpolicella seems to have originated from the Latin Vallis-polis-cellae which literally translated means "valleys with many cellars". This territory, rich in history, culture and tradition, alternates Venetian villas, palaces and ancient rural courtyards with expanses of vineyards, olive and cherry trees, and is dotted with ancient Romanesque churches and small rustic chapels. A unique and evocative landscape that will offer you countless opportunities for relaxation. Another way to fully enjoy your visit is to sample the local food and wine, in an area which for centuries has been dedicated almost exclusively to the cultivation of vines. Valpolicella is famous for its fine wines, such as Amarone, which is a symbol of the region's wine tradition. The hospitality of the locals adds an extra special touch to the experience, making the stay even more authentic and welcoming.

SOAVE - EST VERONESE

Wineries, villas, churches, history and traditions, unique flavours and beautiful rolling hills. Here we are in the lands of Soave - Est Veronese, which we discover through an itinerary that winds between historical and environmental attractions and starts in the medieval town from which it takes its name. Enclosed within the intact city walls that rise to the top of the hill where the Scaliger castle stands, Soave exudes an air of art and history at every turn. Outside the walls of Soave, the territory of the East Veronese extends between the Val d'Ilasi, the Val d'Alpone and the Val Tramigna, which take their name from the rivers that run through them and that have shaped their history and landscape. Hills full of vineyards and olive groves allow outdoor activities such as mountain biking, trekking and horseback riding, as well as sampling in the winery.

Venezia

A GEM TO TREASURE

Classified as a UNESCO World Heritage Site since 1987, Venice and its lagoon are a one-of-a-kind ecosystem that must be preserved and protected, given its unique vulnerability. This is precisely why the city supports a sustainable tourism to protect its integrity. There are many associations, agencies and institutions that offer a conscious tour of Venice, by suggesting alternative routes to a “hit and run” tourism in search of a more secretive and authentic Venice.

A CITY FOR ALL SEASONS

The thing about Venice is that it will always surprise you, in any season. Whenever you choose to go, the city will be ready to welcome you, surprise you and let you have a good time. Every season has its perks, its special atmospheres, its international events: the Venice Film Festival at the end of August, the Carnival with its merry calendar in the winter, the Vogalonga and Marriage of the Sea ceremony in spring, and the Festa del Redentore in the summer. However, the city of the Doges is perfect to visit and enjoy also in its every-day life... washing lines on windows and terraces, the clamour of people passing by, houses and palaces as lace on water...

UNUSUAL ITINERARIES

If you already know San Marco, Rialto and Palazzo Ducale in Venice, or if you already visited Palazzo Grassi with its art exhibitions and the churches embellished by Tiziano and Tintoretto's paintings, take some time to visit the most unusual parts of Venice, such as the quaint Fish Market, or leave the Canal Grande behind and sail with a gondola on the innermost streams along silent squares and roads. Then pamper yourself by visiting the Venice of luxury brands, which includes the 16th century Fontego dei Tedeschi, the former Palazzo delle Poste renovated by Rem Koolhaas and transformed into a prestigious shopping temple with haute couture brands and Venetian high craftsmanship shops. It has an amazing architecture: three arcaded floors with inner courtyard, illuminated by a gigantic skylight from above and a freely accessible breath-taking terrace with an impressive view of the city. Countless emotions in Venice. Don't miss the Jewish ghetto with its ancient synagogues. You can get there easily from Ponte delle Guglie in Strada Nuova to dive into its peculiar atmosphere.

From here, you can reach the Fondamenta Nuove and a long route streaked with peculiar sights, such as Campo dei Mori, named after the four 13th century statues enclosed in the façade of a house on the corner.

GOING TO “BÀCARI”, A VENETIAN CUSTOM

“Bàcari” are the meeting spots of the real Venice. If you want to get to know the truer and more secret city, take a tour of the authentic Venetian corners, atmospheres and flavours, off the usual tourist routes. You can recognize a typical bàcaro, or bacarèto, by some unmistakable details: an old sign, a long bar, its warm, rustic and “seasoned” dark wood furniture, the conversations among the clients almost always in heavy Venetian dialect. Unleash the foodie in you and choose between the many “cichèti” - small meat, cold cuts, cheese and fish tapas - make sure to taste the meatballs, the creamed codfish, the Venetian-style “spienza” (spleen), the small octopus, the “sarde in saor”, the marinated or fried anchovies, the pumpkin “in saor”... One last thing, douse it with a glass of “honest” wine.



BEAUTY AND FUN

The city will wait for you while you take a break: it is the largest pedestrian zone in the world; no stress, just the desire to stroll, look, being charmed by a shop window, a palace, a square where the only sound is children laughing and playing... Therefore, in Venice surprises are everywhere and you always bump into something interesting: antique stores, workshops where you can witness a papiermâché mask being made, niche bookshops and tailor's shop specialized in creating 18th century clothes, those that you usually see parading along the alley during the Carnival period. Let's not forget the entertainment: the Casino with its gaming tables, the famous Harry's Bar on Calle Vallaresso for happy hour and the Fenice, the beautiful theatre which has risen from “its ashes” after a tremendous fire destroyed it. Its broad agenda offers many occasions to listen to some fine music or to see a quality show.



ART AND CULTURE

You can't miss the Magazzini del Sale in Dorsoduro, renovated by Renzo Piano by the will of sculptor and painter Emilio Vedova and his wife, who wanted to transform them in a cultural centre to house exhibits and events. The great artist Vedova used to work here, at the Zattere, and his lab, which is open to visit, was set in a 16th century "squero", an ancient workshop where shipwrights built Venetian boats. Talking about artworks, Venice boasts several modern and contemporary arts temples: Ca' Pesaro with works by Klimt, Rodin, Kandinsky and Klee, the Guggenheim Museum with works by Picasso, Mondrian, Mirò, Ernst, Duchamp, Giacometti and Magritte, Palazzo Fortuny with the precious artworks and collections of its namesake owner, and the Biennale, of course, with its art, architecture, dance, theatre and music programs...



VENICE LIDO, THE VENETIAN BEACH

The Venice Lido awaits you with other vibes; a unique place for its Liberty villas and luxury hotels, the exclusive background of the Venice Film Festival which summons enthusiasts from all over the world at the end of August. The Lido, with plenty of historical and naturalistic surprises, such as the ancient monastery of San Nicolò, the picture-perfect town of Malamocco. and the WWF Oasis "Dune degli Alberoni", has always been the Venetian

beach. With its sandy beaches and its sloping seabed, it is perfect for families with children. It houses the impressive "cabanas", the fabled large cabins with veranda and tent on private beaches, fully-fledged beach "living rooms" to relax and hang out. There are also nice free beaches: Alberoni and San Nicolò, with their sandy dunes, the popular Bluemoon and, lastly, Murazzi, for those who prefer the reef.



THE ISLANDS, A TOUR YOU DON'T WANT TO MISS

Venice would not be Venice without its amazing lagoon, a world of heart-breaking environments, intense landscapes, ancient fishing valleys, untapped sandbanks and silent islands swept by majestic or rapid storms of seagulls, mallards, stilt plovers, little terns, egrets, white and grey herons, coots and marsh harriers. An archipelago to explore by boat, perhaps booking a day trip that will let you discover an astounding world. There are many docks: the popular Murano and Burano, the glass and embroidery islands, and minor islands such as Sant'Elena, on the eastern edge of the city, in the Castello district, in the lesser-known Venice. And also San Michele, with its monumental cemetery, Giudecca with folk atmospheres and yet home of the star-studded Cipriani, San Servolo transformed into an internationally-renowned cultural centre, San Lazzaro with its Armenian Mechitarist monks, San Giorgio in front of San Marco, Torcello full of archaeological finds, churches and museums, San Erasmo that houses the Venetian gardens, and, south of Burano, the isolated and spiritual San Francesco del Deserto. There are other two gems to complete this island hopping: San Clemente and Mazzorbo, two oases of peace where first fruits and rare native grape varieties are farmed, enhanced by exclusive hotels and Michelin-starred restaurants.

THE OFFICIAL TICKETING OF MILANO CORTINA 2026

Twenty years on, the Olympic and Paralympic Winter Games are back to amaze, inspire and entertain all spectators, both Italian and international, in some of the **most iconic places in our country in Veneto**, such as Cortina d'Ampezzo and the Verona Arena, which will host the Closing Ceremony of the Milano Cortina 2026 Olympics and the Opening Ceremony of the Milano Cortina 2026 Paralympics.

Ticket sales for the Milano Cortina 2026 **Winter Olympics** started in **February 2025**, and those for the **Winter Paralympics** in **March 2025**... one year away from the respective opening ceremonies, but the countdown has already begun!

HOW TO BUY TICKETS FOR the Olympic

The ticket sales for the Olympic Winter Games in Milano Cortina 2026 take place in two phases. In the first phase, which closed on 15 January 2025, people could sign up on the Milano Cortina 2026 platform to participate in the draw for priority tickets sales slot.

In the second phase, dedicated to those who did not participate in the draw, the sale of tickets for the Olympics will open in April 2025 and depends on remaining availability.

Access to the Ticketing platform is guaranteed worldwide; tickets will be 100% digital and available on the Milano Cortina 2026 Tickets app, which will be available to download from December 2025.

- 6** In April 2025, the sale of Olympic tickets will open for those who did not participate in the draw.

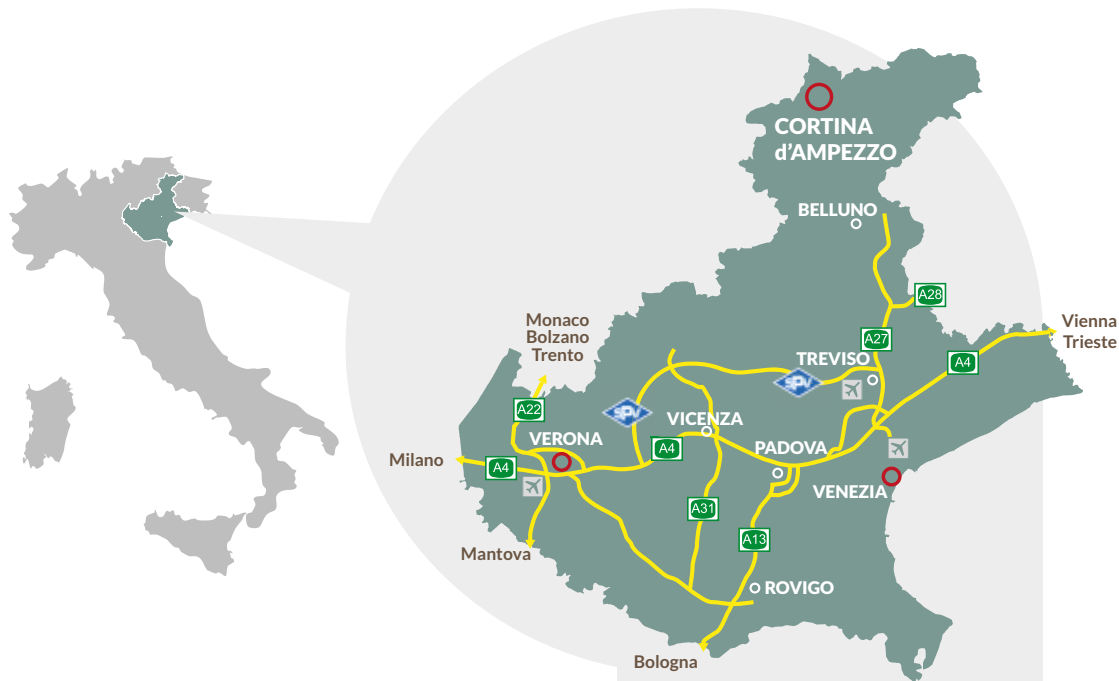
